What is an DoD ID/EDIPI?

The Department of Defense identification number, formerly referred to as the Electronic Data Interchange Personal Identifier (EDIPI), is a unique 10-digit number that is associated with personnel and their Common Access Card (CAC). The DoD ID is assigned to each person registered in the Defense Enrollment and Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS). This includes government civilians, active duty military, dependents, reservists, retirees and contractors. In time, the DoD ID number will replace the SSN in many DoD business processes. When a document is digitally signed, the DoD ID number is displayed in the signature block.

- * DoD ID/EDIPI applies to All Employees (APF/NAF/LN)
- * DoD ID = Department of Defense Identification
- * EDIPI = Electronic Data Interchange Person Identifier

How can I find out what my DoD ID/EDIPI? is?

- The DoD ID number is displayed on the back of the CAC Card.
- When a document is digitally signed, the DoD ID number is displayed in the signature block.
